Here's to exploring new journeys together!



FUNDS RAISED




LUNCH DEBT PAID IN FULL

Thanks to 62 generous donors who contributed \$8,920, and support from the **Student Needs Fund**, 298 student's lunch accounts were paid off for the 2024–25 school year—erasing \$13,273.84 in debt. Through the power of community, all students started the new school year with zero lunch debt.

HELPING STUDENTS FOCUS WITH CALM STRIPS

A **Classroom Grant** to 4th-grade teacher Marshall Keough at Pine Creek Elementary provided Calm Strips—low-distraction, tactile tools that help nearly 100 students manage energy and improve focus.

This simple innovation helps meet diverse social-emotional and behavioral needs so all students can succeed.




INVESTING IN COLLEGE READINESS

Through our **AP Test Reimbursement** initiative, Bennington High School students took 244 AP exams in 2024–25. Each year, the Foundation covers half the cost—about \$11,000—while the High School covers the other half, so students face no financial barrier. Support for dual-certified teachers and AP courses like this gives students like 2025 BHS graduate Baylor Detjens a head start, allowing him to enter Syracuse University as a sophomore.

7TH GRADERS EXPLORE SCIENCE THROUGH MARS AND EARTH

At Bennington Middle School, 7th graders brought real-world science to life with Martian soil kits funded by a **Classroom Grant**. Led by teacher Lindsey Wilson, students designed experiments testing sunlight, water, and soil variables, connecting Earth's ecosystems to Mars while developing critical thinking, collaboration, and scientific inquiry skills.




CONNECTING COMMUNITY SUPPORT TO STUDENT CREATIVITY

Bennington High School English teacher Ben Tompkins had an idea for a short story contest, and community member Connie Wickham generously offered to fund the prizes. The Foundation connected them, launching the Inkwell Short Story Contest, celebrating student writing and imagination, and inspiring a new student writing club—showing how community support brings teacher-led ideas to life.


HAL STUDENTS HARNESS THE POWER OF PODCASTING

At Bennington Middle School and Bennington South Middle School, HAL students are exploring creativity and technology through podcasting.

With portable recording cubes and microphones funded by a **Classroom Grant**, students wrote, recorded, and produced 28 shows, developing collaboration, communication, and 21st-century skills while sharing their work with a real audience.
